#### i. <u>Annual Policing Plan for 2023-24</u>



## <u>NEW INITIATIVES</u>

## i. <u>eFOAS</u>

e-FOAS (e-Filling & Office Automation System), designed by the Punjab Information Technology Board (PITB), has been launched in District Gujrat with the collaboration of the office of Regional Police Officer, Gujranwala Region. e-FOAS is a cloud based electronic filing and office automation system designed to save time and cost.

In many cases, heavy losses were reported by various departments because a critical document was lost. The PITB has developed the e-Filing and Office Automation System to enable timely and effective management of official daily tasks and proceed towards a paperless office environment in the public sector. The main objective of this management software is to ensure that every correspondence is digitally accessible round-the-clock.

This explicitly designed system deals with the Office File Management, Receipt & Issuance Management, Document Archiving & Management, Performance Management, Information & Knowledge Sharing, Meeting Scheduling & Management.

In e-FOAS the documents can be scanned and converted in paper files, letters, documents etc. and archive them together with existing workflows, task lists and note sheets. Once indexed, instantly search can be mad from all the available information and control, manage & work on all of the documents and files which are readily available in out swift archival system.

e-FOAS supports document capture, archival, control, approval, integration, process automation, collaboration and tracking into one innovative platform. Whilst Information security's significance is vital for many government organization's, e-FOAS brings together

controls for document access with mobile and web based document retrieval & processing clients. With powerful search feature the required information is readily accessible, whenever it is essential.

The PITB is in the process of deploying this system in 13 public agencies including the Law Department (GoPb), the Lahore Waste Management Company (LWMC), Bahawalpur Waste Management Company (BWMC), the Punjab Forensic Lab (GoPb), Chief Secretary's Office and Camp Office, Planning and Development Department (GoPb), Finance Department (GoPb), Ombudsman Office (GoPb), S&GAD (GoPb), DIG Operations Office in Lahore (GoPb), the CPO's Office, District Bahawalnagar (GoPb) and Overseas Pakistani Foundation Pakistan (OPF).*Source: https://pitb.gov.pk/efoas* 

#### ii. Police Training Courses, Gujrat

In compliance of directions of W/Inspector General of Police, Punjab, Lahore and under the supervision of Training Branch, IGP Office, Punjab, a lower class course has been started with the collaboration of PTS Rawat, in July 2023 in District Police Lines, Gujrat, headed by an experienced Chief Law Instructor, who is an officer of Inspector rank. Initially, four months Lower Class Course is undergoing in the Police Lines Gujrat, where total number of 184 constables borne on List B-I, 177 male and 07 female, are being trained, under the course outline designed by the Training Branch, Punjab, Lahore.

#### 6. <u>COMMENTS BY THE DPO:</u>

The roles and responsibilities of the Punjab Police are designed in the Police Order 2002. Our key performance indicators are based on innovative tools of control encompassing every area of policing. Our major concern is to prevent, restrict and retard the tide of rising crime, abuse of human rights and terrorism.

We will continue to provide traditional, visible and accessible policing to local communities. In addition, for tackling traditional and visible crime and criminality we must find different ways to prevent, disrupt and respond to the ever more inventive and complex use of digital tools and tactics.

We also remember the sacrifices of our Police Officers who offered their lives stem out the heinous crime which has blighted our beloved country. In this back drop, we have endeavored to prepare Annual Policing Plan 2023-24, to reset, revise and review our goals, objectives and targets to meet the challenges of the future.
