

Population:

According to the last Census the population of district Sahiwal has been calculated as **2517560** persons.

Economics & Crimes.

Sahiwal is a rural district. Major portion of the agricultural land of the district is highly fertile. Major portion of its economy revolves around agriculture. The main crops of district Sahiwal are Wheat, Cotton, Rice, Potato, sugarcane, Maize and Vegetables. Financial status of majority of the population of the district is average.

The economy of any society has a bearing on attitude of the people residing in a particular area. It has a deep impact upon the crime and its pattern. In well-of societies, the crime ratio remains low, whereas in poor societies, the crime ratio has always been found high. The most of financially depressed persons / groups of persons are more likely to be attracted towards crime and sometimes are forced to commit crimes of different types i.e. robbery, dacoity, gambling, cheating, narcotics etc. to meet their financial requirements.

Climate and crimes

Climate of every locality always affects the nature of crimes. During Winter season, when people usually sleep in rooms having least connection with side rooms or cattle sheds in rural areas, the crime of cattle theft usually increases. During Summer/hot season, the people usually sleep in their courtyards or roofs of the houses, therefore, the crime of burglary shows an upward trend, as the burglars take the benefit of the situation.

NEEDS OF THE COMMUNITY

In order to know the needs of community and to ascertain what the general public expects from police, opinions of different segments of society i.e. public representatives, representatives of commercial unions, NGOs and Civil Society have been obtained by carrying out a survey and arranging meetings, seminars and interviews of the notables, professionals and common men. Keeping in view their opinions, the following points regarding expected police working have come to light.

- b. Upholding rule of law.
- c. Quick response to public calls.
- d. Prevention and detection of crime.
- e. Improvement in police behavior (change in Thana Culture).

- i. To assist people of community irrespective of their caste, creed, sex, political affiliations, their ethnic or social background.
- j. Adherence to the Code of Conduct.

k. To enhance relationship between police and all sections of society.

- 2. Meaningful patrolling in order to minimize the incidents of vehicle theft, mobile phone snatching, Highway dacoity /robbery, burglary and street crime etc.

- 4. Ensuring a culture of transparency and decent behavior with the citizens.
- 5. Prompt registration of FIRs
- 6. Effective strategies to prevent and detect crimes and to eradicate terrorism.



Analysis of Crime:

The above tables depict that during the year 2023-2024, the overall crime has shown a mixed trend. There is an increase under heads Murder, Attempted Murder, Rape/Gang, Hurt, Abduction/Kidnapping for Ransom, Dacoity, Robbery, Burglary, Cattle Theft, Auto Theft, Ordinary Theft, Gambling Ordinance, Prohibition Ordinance, Arms Ordinance and Sound system Ordinance.

During the period under report, property valued Rs.865448795/- was stolen out of which property valued Rs.307285101/- was recovered. The percentage of recovery remained 36%. The average detection percentage of the crime against person & property remained 41%, which is remarkable.

GENERAL REVIEW OF THE CRIME DURING THE PRECEDING YEAR UNDER MAJOR HEADS:

Murder.

During the period under report 120 cases under this head were reported, out of which 98 cases were detected. The detection rate was 82%. In these cases 367 accused were involved, out of which 269 criminals were arrested. The percentage of arrested accused remained 73%.

Attempted Murder.

During the period under report 135 cases under this head were reported, out of which 105 cases were detected. The detection rate was 78%. In these cases 482 accused were involved, out of which 365 criminals were arrested. The percentage of arrested accused remained 76%.

Hurt.

During the period under report 480 cases under this head were reported, out of which 387 cases were detected. The detection rate was 81%. In these cases 2143 accused were involved, out of which 1623 criminals were arrested. The percentage of arrested accused remained 76%.

Rape/Gang Rape.

During the period under report 79 cases under this head were reported, out of which all 69 cases were detected. The detection rate remained 87%. In these cases 121 accused were involved, out of which 98 criminals were arrested. The percentage of arrested accused remained 68%.

Abduction for Ransom:

During the period under report 02 cases under this head were reported out of which 02 cases were cancelled.

Dacoity:

During the period under report 46 cases under this head were reported, out of which 31 cases were detected. The detection rate was 67%. In these cases 282 accused were involved, out of which 100 criminals were arrested. The percentage of arrested accused remained 35 %.

Property worth Rs. 47983500/- was snatched out of which property worth Rs.27694900/- was recovered. The percentage of recovery remained 58%.

Robbery:

During the period under report 1457 cases under this head were reported, out of which 763 cases were detected. The detection rate was 52%. In these cases 3993 accused were involved, out of which 1647 criminals were arrested. The percentage of arrested accused remained 41%.

Property worth Rs.209985879/- was snatched out of which property worth Rs.92861120/- was recovered. The percentage of recovery remained 44%.

Burglary:

During the period under report 922 cases under this head were reported, out of which 273 cases were detected. The detection rate was 30%. In these cases 2212 accused were involved, out of which 486 criminals were arrested. The percentage of arrested accused remained 22%.

Property worth Rs.160164364/- was snatched out of which property worth Rs.30920750/- was recovered. The percentage of recovery remained 19%.

Vehicle Theft:

During the period under report 1356 cases under this head were reported, out of which 449 cases were detected. The detection rate was 33%. In these cases 1732 accused were involved, out of which 591 criminals were arrested. The percentage of arrested accused remained 34%.

Property worth Rs.83150800/- was snatched out of which property worth Rs.35557500/- was recovered. The percentage of recovery remained 43%.

Cattle Theft:

During the period under report 726 cases under this head were reported, out of which 250 cases were detected. The detection rate was 34%. In these cases 1779 accused were involved, out of which 429 criminals were arrested. The percentage of arrested accused remained 24%.

Property worth Rs.107201000/- was snatched out of which property worth Rs.14532000/- was recovered. The percentage of recovery remained 14%.

Ordinary Theft:

During the period under report 2165 cases under this head were reported, out of which 817 cases were detected. The detection rate was 38%. In these cases 3852 accused were involved, out of which 1235 criminals were arrested. The percentage of arrested accused remained 32%.

Property worth Rs.256963252/- was snatched out of which property worth Rs.105718831/- was recovered. The percentage of recovery remained 41%.

Gangs Busted:


